INTERNATIONAL PRESENTER:

Bryan Lipmann is the Chief Executive Officer and founder of Wintringham, a not-for-profit welfare company employing over 300 people to provide an extensive range of high quality residential, community based and outreach services to elderly men and women, most of whom are homeless or at risk of homelessness. He has worked with elderly homeless people for more than 20 years. An important identifying feature of Wintringham’s work has been its insistence that homeless elderly men and women should have the same right of access to generic aged care services and resources as the rest of the aged community. Bryan has sat on a number of Ministerial Advisory Committees in Melbourne and in Canberra working on issues effecting homeless elderly people, including the Victorian Homelessness Strategy, and the National Homelessness Strategy.
